

CITY COUNCIL MEETING

6-1-20

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, June 1, 2020 at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead and Sarah Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Assistant City Clerk Nicholas New, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Ray Stansell and Madilyn Wolfe from the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson went over the COVID-19 Update (print-out attached) Library will open at regular time of 9:30; playground will be sanitized 2 times a day by City guys. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith. The vote was unanimous. Mayor said it has been 3 weeks today since there was a case in Clay County. Again, he thanked all the city employees for all their efforts made in keeping everyone safe. Assistant Clerk Nicholas New gave an update on Court starting again Thursday, June 4 at regular time. They have prepared for social distancing. It has been 2 months since they held Court due to COVID-19.

City Supervisor Rusty Taylor gave an update on baseball. The season is cancelled. They did not have enough interested parties to play and rules were almost impossible to follow. Uniforms will be given out at a scheduled drive-by to the kids and parents by the Coaches and Rusty. All cities have cancelled. Rusty also gave an update on the former White Furniture Building scheduled to be demolished. He has received 3 calls from Ms. Linda Gunn regarding this building.

Council Member David Proctor announced that the Park Board will hold its annual golf tournament on Saturday, June 20. David also asked Donna about the status of the pocket park and Donna advised him that she would check with Jamie. Many of the state offices are still working from home and she thought that Jamie hadn't received anything new since her last email.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Sarah Appleby. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:15 p.m.
