

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
11-4-19

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, November 4, 2019, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, Court Clerk Nicholas New, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Lt. Richard Bickerstaff, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Keifer Smith from the Clay Times Journal. Council Member Johnny Appleby was not present for the meeting.

Mayor Adamson then called the meeting to order. Mayor Adamson asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes of the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next Mayor Adamson asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid.
