

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
1-6-2020

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, January 6, 2019, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, Assistant City Clerk Nicholas New, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Keifver Smith from the Clay Times Journal, guest were Sara Appleby and Paul Graben.

Mayor Adamson then called the meeting to order. Mayor Adamson asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes of the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next Mayor Adamson asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. (See attached) A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

Chief Shane Dunnagan requested to run an ad in the paper to advertise for a dispatcher. He had a dispatcher quit without giving any notice and he would like to get someone hired at next meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to run the ad and take applications until January 21, 2020, at 12:00 noon. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson told the Council that the next meeting fell on Martin Luther King Day and the meeting needed to be changed to Wednesday, January 22, 2020. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson said 2020 is going to be a busy year with elections, census, working with grants to improve industrial parks, do some paving hopefully, the pocket park and not to mention other things we've got going on. Again, I want to thank all that worked in any way decorating the City for Christmas, it looked great.

Chief Shane Dunnagan thanked the City for the opportunity to go to the FBI Academy. He said he learned so much that would be beneficial to his job and to the entire department. Council Member David Proctor said he was glad to have him back and felt it was an honor for him to have had that opportunity to complete such a school as this.
