

**COUNCIL MEETING**  
**11-2-20**

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, November 2, 2020, at 4:30 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead and Larry Bishop, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Assistant Clerk Nicholas New, and Madelyn Wolfe of the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next Mayor Adamson asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead. He concluded by thanking Rusty and his crew for how well the park looked.

Council Member Larry Bishop said he was glad to be aboard.

Chief Shane Dunnagan announced that the Police Department was still without telephones and if you need them you will need to call 256-396-0643. We still have trees down everywhere and we are without power again.

City Supervisor Rusty Taylor thanked his guys for a long hard weekend, he thanked the citizens, the Police and the Fire Department for all their help. The cleanup we have got to do is putting us out about one and a half (1 ½) months. We have lots of damage to trees, the stage in the park, the press box and concession stand. The back maintenance shed is destroyed. We just ask that everyone be patient with us because we have our hands full and doing all we can do.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member David Proctor. The vote was unanimous. The meeting adjourned at 9:50 a.m.
