

**CITY COUNCIL MEETING**  
**3-4-19**

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, March 4, 2019, at the City Hall Annex in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, Johnny Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, and Ray Stansell from the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Next Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Johnny Appleby to approve the bills to be paid. The following bills were approved to be paid: (see attached list)

First on the agenda was the Voting Delegate to be named for the upcoming Alabama League of Municipalities Conference in Mobile beginning on May 4, 2019. The City will need to name the delegate and a 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> alternate. Mayor Adamson then appointed Council Member Carolyn Smith to serve as the Voting Delegate; Council Member Joseph Appleby to serve as 1<sup>st</sup> Alternate and Council Member David Proctor to serve as 2<sup>nd</sup> Alternate.

Next City Supervisor Rusty Taylor brought it to the attention of the City that maintenance employee Tyler Mastin had completed his probationary period with the City and he recommends hiring him in a permanent full-time position. A motion was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member David Proctor to hire Tyler Mastin in a permanent full-time position with the City. The vote was unanimous.

Next on the agenda Chief Shane Dunnagan discussed the Firearms Certification and the changes that had been made and the new recent laws required through APOST. We will now be certifying through NRA at an approximate cost of \$1100.00. I would like requests that you send Officer Jarred Brown for this certification and he will be the firearms instructor for our police department. A motion was then made by Council Member Carolyn Smith and seconded by Council Member David Proctor to send Jarred Brown for training. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson next appoint Council Member David Proctor and Council Member Joseph Appleby to serve on the review committee for the applications that had been taken on the open position of Court Clerk/Magistrate. You will meet at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday to review application. A motion was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby to table the hire of that position until the applications could be reviewed and interviews done. The vote was unanimous.

Council Member Carolyn Smith shared the plaque that had been presented the City by the Clay County Shriners for the use of the park for their annual car show. They raised approximately \$30,000.00 this year. It was a great turn out of show cars and people and much hard work went in to this event.

Mayor Adamson advised that the deed for the theatre building has been executed by the members of the Lineville Downtown Redevelopment Board giving it back to the City. City Supervisor Rusty Taylor said the contractors are already lined up for the necessary repairs to that building.

City Supervisor Rusty Taylor also gave an update on the baseball program for this season. There are at this time 335 kids signed up to play with a total of 30 teams. Practice started today and games will begin April 1. On 3/17/19 there will be a meeting at the City Annex building with approximately 100 coaches. We also got the grass off field number 1 and got the brick some brick dust down and waiting on another load to get field ready.

Council Member David Proctor reminded everyone of the Golf Tournament sponsored by the Lineville Park Board on March 23, 2019. Also there will be an egg hunt for the community and spring show by the Lineville Merchants Association on April 20, 2019 in the Lineville Park. He thanked City Supervisor Rusty Taylor and his crew for all their hard work on the Lineville Theatre.

After no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Johnny Appleby. The vote was unanimous. The meeting adjourned at 5:19 p.m.
