

**WORK SESSION**  
**5-7-2018**

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in a work session on Monday, May 7, 2018, at 4:30 p.m. at the City Hall Annex in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, and Johnny Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Administrator Donna Mathews, City Maintenance Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Ray Stansell with the Clay Times Journal, and City Clerk Cynthia Harris. Council Member Carolyn Smith was not present due to being out of town.

Mayor Adamson mentioned Law Day was Thursday, May 10, 2018, at 12:00 noon at the Farmer's Market. The ribbon cutting for the Wash Barn is tomorrow at 10:00 a.m. The League Convention will be May 19<sup>th</sup> through the 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Mayor Adamson mentioned that the WLC Foods' project is off. A letter was sent to the city indicating higher cost than initially thought and may look at doing at a later date. The engineer and grant writer are still working on trying to get the road work done that was part of this project.

City Clerk Cynthia Harris presented quarterly reports to the Council for their review. Cynthia went over the report and indicated some budget items have been purchased at the beginning of the fiscal year so some line items that appear over will budget out at year end. Cynthia said the goal is to have the line of credit paid off this year and all departments are broke down in the handout. Mayor Adamson asked everyone to review and ask any questions if they have any.

Mayor Adamson said one bid was received on the head start building from Mr. Lauby for \$10,000.00 which was rejected. Mr. Lauby was asked if he wanted to make a counter offer. Mayor Adamson said some of the land will be taken out that holds the graveyard.

City Maintenance Supervisor Rusty Taylor said the new fire truck arrived a week ago and will be put into service in about one week. The truck cost over \$300,000 in which the fire department received a grant with a 5% match. Rusty said the donation from the water bills is really helping the fire department.

The work session ended at 4:57 p.m.
