

COUNCIL MEETING
2-3-2020

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, February 3, 2020, at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, and Sarah Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Assistant City Clerk Nicholas New, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, and Keifver Smith from the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson welcomed Sarah Appleby to the District 5 position in serving the City.

First on the agenda was a petition for annexation. Mayor Adamson said that a petition for annexation was presented from Fred McLeod and wife, Jimmie McLeod to bring property owned by them into the City Limits of Lineville. Mayor Adamson said the proper Ordinance has been prepared.

Next on the agenda was Ordinance 2020-02-3-1 for annexation of property owned by Fred McLeod and wife, Jimmie McLeod. City Clerk Donna Mathews read the Ordinance into the minutes. A motion to introduce Ordinance 2020-02-3-1 was then made by Council Member Carolyn Smith and seconded by Council Member David Proctor. The vote was as follows:

Next on the Agenda was Ordinance 2020-02-3-2 to amend the alcohol Ordinance to offer a combo option for Wholesale Beer and Wine and the cost of such Combination License for Wholesale Beer and Wine to be established at a fee of \$375.00 in accordance with the “Uniform Beer Tax Act,” Code of Alabama, 1975, Section 28-3-190 – 28-3-199 and the “Alabama Table Wine Act,” Code of Alabama, 1975, Sections 28-7-24. A motion to adopt Ordinance 2020-02-3-2 was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was as follows:

The vote was unanimous.

Chief Shane Dunnagan recommended the City hire Shannon House as full time police officer with starting pay rate at \$16.50 with a 6 month probation. A motion was then made by Council Member Carolyn Smith and seconded by Council Member David Proctor. The vote was unanimous. Chief Dunnagan also has a letter of termination to present on Tim Mitchell effective January 27, 2020, when he walked out of the Police Academy. Several attempts have been made to speak with him but at this point I have not talked to Mr. Mitchell.

City Supervisor Rusty Taylor declared 2 buildings in downtown Lineville as unsafe buildings. The first one belongs to Ramona Giddens, the old Today's Flowers building and the second one belongs to J. P. White, Jr., and is known as the old White's Furniture building. Notices will be sent to these individuals and signs will go up on the buildings marking them as unsafe. Rusty also reminded everyone that baseball signups start tomorrow night and that the will be attending the State meeting on February 22nd and 23rd.

Council Member Carolyn Smith thanked the police and Chief Dunnagan for accommodating a citizen with their garbage can. Thanks for going that extra step to help someone. She also welcomed Sarah Appleby to the Council.

Council Member David Proctor asked City Supervisor Rusty Taylor if he thinks we will get any tournaments here this year and Rusty said maybe we will. David also welcomed Sarah Appleby.

Council Member Joseph Appleby and Council Member Robert Milstead joined in with welcoming Sarah Appleby to the Council seat of District 5.

After no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was unanimous. The meeting was adjourned at 5:28 p.m.
