

## **CITY COUNCIL MEETING 4-20-2020**

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, April 20, 2020, at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, and Sarah Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Assistant City Clerk Nicholas New, and City Supervisor Rusty Taylor. Council Members Joseph Appleby and Robert Milstead were absent from meeting.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Carolyn Smith and seconded by Council Member Sarah Appleby to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson asked City Clerk Donna Mathews to call and ask the auditors about getting the hard copies of the Financial Statement for 2019 and we will table for on these until we all have the proper copies.

AMIC voting delegates form came to appoint your voting delegate, first alternate, and second alternate. Not sure there will be a convention this year but we will go ahead and do this and send it back in to League. Carolyn Smith, Voting Delegate, David Proctor, First Alternate and Sarah Appleby, Second Alternate. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Sarah Appleby to approve the appointments. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson said the City is operating as best it can at this time with COVID-19. Library is still closed to public, Nutrition is still serving home delivery meals and we will continue to follow the State guidelines. Mayor asked City Supervisor Rusty Taylor to give an update on his department and he said they are working some longer days, some shorter and they have quit eating lunch together at the shop and no one is riding together in the same truck at this time.

Council Member Carolyn Smith asked if we knew any names of anyone who has the virus. Council Member Sarah Appleby said she knows some she has heard but doesn't want to say and Mayor Adamson said there's some here I'm sure but we don't know who they are and don't want to call any names or go on hearsay.

Council Member David Proctor asked Rusty if the lights are going to be fixed at the First State Bank. Rusty said he has tried to call the guy and has had no success getting in touch with him. Council Member Proctor also asked Rusty why the sirens didn't go off when tested. Rusty told him they are working here and he wasn't aware of any of them not going off. Council Proctor also wanted to know where we stand with the buildings downtown and the cleanup progress. Rusty told him that all 3 owners are served and only 1 of them has given a cleanup plan and that is Doris Allen that owns the building next to the Mayor's office.

After no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Carolyn Smith and seconded by Council Member David Proctor. The vote was unanimous. The meeting adjourned at 5:13 p.m.
