

**CITY COUNCIL MEETING**  
**5-4-20**

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, May 4, 2020, at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead and Sarah Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Assistant City Clerk Nicholas New, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor and Keifver Smith from the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

First item on the agenda was to discuss the new “Safer at Home” order. Mayor plans on keeping things the same as we have it right now in the City until May 15 and we will review it again at that meeting.

City Clerk Donna Mathews then presented the Resolution 5-4-2020-1 for the Sales Tax Holiday for back to school purchases that will be in effect from 12:01 a.m. on Friday, July 17, 2020 and ending at twelve midnight on Sunday, July 19, 2020. A motion was then made by Council Member Carolyn Smith to accept the Resolution as presented, seconded by Council Member Sarah Appleby. The vote was unanimous.

Next on the agenda was the hiring of a part-time, fill-in bus driver for the Nutrition Center. Gail Lynn Cruea has applied for the position. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson thanked all the City employees for a good job on everyone’s part during this COVID-19.

City Supervisor Rusty Taylor gave an update on baseball season saying that it may go on but will possibly eliminate tournaments. There may be limited practices in June. We are starting to hear some dates from the district level. Also, the 3 buildings downtown we have been working on to get cleaned up, repaired or torn down, we now have service on all 3 and the 45 day notice is up now. Our next step is to start working on demolition by getting costs. Mayor told him to get City Attorney Keith Warren to review it and have him meet with us at the next meeting during work session and talk about it.

Council Member David Proctor said that the Park Board is going to meet to discuss rescheduling the golf tournament and 60’s Under the Stars. He also asked Rusty what, if any, plans have been turned in on the cleanup of these 3 buildings in town. Rusty advised it all has been verbal, nothing in writing.

After no further business, a motion to adjourn was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:16 p.m.
