

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
4-6-2020

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, April 6, 2020, at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, and Sarah Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Assistant City Clerk Nicholas New, and City Supervisor Rusty Taylor.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

First on the agenda was Resolution 4-6-2020-1 Affirming support of health orders issued by Alabama Department of Public Health relating to the Novel Coronavirus COVID-19 outbreak. The Resolution was a joint Resolution between the City of Lineville, City of Ashland and the Clay County Commission. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith. The vote was unanimous.

Next Mayor Adamson gave an update on COVID-19. Since the last meeting we have closed the playground and picnic areas in the City Park, but the walking trail and lake are still open. The Maintenance workers are riding in separate trucks, no gathering in the shops at the same time. The "Shelter in Place" is in effect. On a positive note, the news today seems to think the curve is flattening out some. Maybe everyone is paying attention and following the rules in place with the 6 feet apart, no gatherings or crowds of more than 10 people.

Chief Shane Dunnagan reported that the police department had 2 incidences over the weekend which they handled with no problems. He has a call in on how to handle crowds larger than 10 or more because the order itself says it allows relatives to visit but everyone says they are kin to everyone. Order is not clear and we definitely don't need the crowds to have to deal with at this time for the safety of the Officers and all involved.

Mayor Adamson advised the Council that the Clerk Donna Mathews had emailed the financial statements to them at this time for review and to vote on at the next meeting.

City Supervisor Rusty Taylor announced that the City of Lineville and Lineville Water and Sewer Board both received the Gold Award for 2019 Risk Management and he contributes this to the Supervisors at keeping the loss ratio at 5% or below. He also updated everyone on the baseball and softball and said it is not cancelled. If allowed this summer, we will have a season.

After no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was unanimous. The meeting was adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
