

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
12-21-20

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, December 21, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, and Larry Bishop, City Clerk Donna Mathews, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Assistant Clerk Nicholas New, Chief Shane Dunnagan, and Kiefver Smith from the Clay Times Journal. Council member Carolyn Smith was absent.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous council meeting. A motion was made by Council Member David Proctor, and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Larry Bishop to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

First on the agenda was the bid specs for the Maintenance Shed, bids will be open until January 15th, 2021 at 5:30 P.M. The bids will then be opened at the work session on January 20th, 2021. A motion was made by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve this timeline of bids, the motion was then seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was unanimous.

Next on the agenda was to approve the new garbage contract with AGL for 2021. The new contract is good for 3 years. A motion was made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Larry Bishop to approve the new contract. The vote was unanimous.

Then on the agenda was to approve the lease of 3 acres of city property to Jim Wakefield. It is a 42 month lease to purchase for \$21,000. The lease is for \$2,500 a year and will apply to the total purchase price at the end of the 42 months. A motion was made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Larry Bishop. The vote was unanimous. City Supervisor Rusty Taylor says that the lease will begin immediately.

Last on the agenda was to fill the opened police officer position. Chief Shane Dunnagan recommends Kody Gamble for the opened position. He can start in two weeks and can be enrolled into the police academy in mid-February. A motion was made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member David Proctor to approve this hire. Chief Dunnagan says that Officer Eatman, who is currently in the police academy, has passed all his physical training and his legals.

Mayor Adamson states that this is the last meeting of 2020. He says this was a good year for the city, but also a very difficult one. Mayor thanks all the dedicated city employees for their hard work during this difficult year, and tells them to remain as safe as possible. City Clerk Donna Mathews reminds the Council that the Statement of Dissolution is due by 12/31/2020 and hands

out the forms for it. City Supervisor Rusty Taylor presents the Council with a plaque and \$2,000 from the Shriners Club for the 2020 Car Show.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:18.
