

**CITY COUNCIL MEETING**  
**6-15-20**

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, June 15, 2020 at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead and Sarah Appleby, Chief Shane Dunnagan, City Clerk Donna Mathews, Assistant City Clerk Nicholas New, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Madilyn Wolfe from the Clay Times Journal and Kevin Acre from Lineville Church of God.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

First item on the agenda was Resolution 6-15-2020-1 Notice of Election. Resolution announcing the upcoming Municipal Election was read aloud by City Clerk Donna Mathews into the minutes. The Resolution is to be published in local paper the week of July 2, 2020, for qualifying to begin on July 7, 2020. A motion was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member David Proctor. The vote was unanimous. Also, City Clerk Donna Mathews read aloud into the minutes Resolution 6-15-2020-2 Election Procurement. A motion was then made by Council Member Carolyn Smith and seconded by Council Member Sarah Appleby. The vote was unanimous.

Next on the agenda was a written request from Lineville Church of God to do a prayer walk kicking off a week of events for their church. It will be 25-30 people walking on the sidewalk along Highway 9 to the corner of Lineville Elementary School, at this point they will stop and pray for the school, City Leaders, Police and Firemen, then they will walk up the hill and around old football field to Nursing Home and stop there to pray and sing for the residents and their caretakers that can't visit them right now. They will walk through at the back of nursing home on the grass to their church building. A motion was then made by Council Member Carolyn Smith and seconded by Council Member Joseph Appleby. The vote was unanimous. Kevin Acre, Pastor of Lineville Church of God was present at the meeting.

Chief Shane Dunnagan recommended hiring Kristopher Echmon as a Patrol Officer. He will work out a 2 week notice with his employment in Oxford. The next academy is 8/28/20. We may or may not be able to get him in this one due to smaller classes because of COVID-19. A motion was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council member David Proctor.

City Supervisor Rusty Taylor let everyone know that the 3 building owners downtown Lineville that are facing demolition have now all been served with Notice to Demolish. Mayor and Council gave Rusty the authority to draw of specs to give to contractors for the demolition.

Mayor Adamson reminded everyone of the Food Box Program on Thursday the 18<sup>th</sup> from 9-11 a.m.

at the Lineville Senior Center. Mayor also said that he and Council Member Sarah Appleby had attended the ribbon cutting at the Commissioner's Office in Ashland for the Veteran's Office that will be opening here in our County.

Council Member David Proctor reminded everyone of the Park Board Golf Tournament on Saturday at 8 a.m. at the Clay County Golf Course. David also thanked Rusty and the maintenance department for a great job of landscaping at the museum. Council Member Carolyn Smith also thanked him and said the outside looks good. She also worked inside museum today cleaning.

Council Member Sarah Appleby said she is receiving complaints about overgrown grass in her district. Mayor told her we would add it to the cleanup list on property cleanups. Council Member David Proctor said the house next to Shine Salon on Highway 9 is in bad shape.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was then made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Sarah Appleby. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:16 p.m.
